Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Sept. 6-11, '21

Mon Deuteronomy 4:1-2,6-8 If we are tempted to close our ears when God lays down the law, we should receive a jolt like this one—sharp and pointed. But why would anyone *add* to God's Word? To create loopholes: "Yes, God's Word is final—except in this case" or "God's Word changes according to changing conditions."

Tues Mark 7:1-8,14-15, 21-23 Self-righteous Jews figured that God had short-changed them, so they added the *traditions of the elders* on top of God's Law. Washing hands is fine, but it does not wash away the filth of *evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders,* etc. So, God does it His way: He cleans our hearts with repentance and faith in Jesus as our Substitute.

Wed Ephesians 6:10-20 "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me" is not a cliché but serious business. We strap on the bullet-proof vest Jesus has crafted for us (14), we buckle up our combat boots (15), and with God's Word we deflect Satan's oncoming missiles (16). "Fight the good fight with all thy might; Christ is thy Strength and Christ thy Right!"

Thurs Psalm 119C Is it possible that a Christian loves God's Law? Yes, for the child of God knows that his Father wants to protect him from harm, just as STOP and YIELD protect motorists from collisions. We appreciate *God's Word, commandments, judgments, statutes, and testimonies* because that's how God provides direction down our highway of life, to avoid potholes and steer clear of oncoming traffic. Thank You, Lord God, for Your holy Word!

Fri John 15:9-17 We love Him because He first loved us; we abide in God's love as we are bonded to His Word/precepts; and loving one another reflects Jesus' love—strong enough to sacrifice Himself for us. That's how we face our sinfulness, and that's how we will face God on Judgment Day.

Sat 2 Peter 3:10-13 Will we ever get to the point that we can bypass "And forgive us our trespasses"? No, not in this world; Jesus knew it, and we know it. That's why this world with its sinfulness (and our share in this world) must be burned away—as metal is refined/purified by boiling away the dross (Psalm 119:119, Malachi 3:3). The world we live in is mortal, subject to decay and death, whereas God's new world will be immortal, rising out of the ashes of fire and death. It will be a world where righteousness and holiness are totally at home and will preoccupy us (13). According to His promise, we look for His new heavens and a new Earth in which righteousness dwells. Come quickly, Lord Jesus! Amen!

INTROIT

Ps. 51:2,7,10-12

- P Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!

In addition to the Biblical testimony that Mark was a close friend and companion of Peter's, some of the ancient Church Fathers (eg. Papias, Bishop of Hierapolis, Eusebius of Caesarea) who were contemporaries of some of the Apostles described Mark as an interpreter of Peter, writing down whatever Peter told him. Others indicate that, having heard the Gospel from the mouth of Peter, Mark was implored to write down the doctrines of Christ in order to preserve them for all people to hear. And thus, by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Gospel according to Mark was written.

Character of the Book: The first verse of Mark's Gospel reads, "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." (Mark 1:1) Thus, from the outset, he leaves little guesswork over what this book would be about or who this Jesus was. However, this is the last time in the Gospel that Mark tells the readers what he believes about Jesus. Throughout the rest of the book, he simply shows the reader Jesus' actions and Jesus' words and then relates how the original witnesses reacted to these things. Mark's is a Gospel of action, moving rapidly from one event to the next, laying out the irrefutable proofs that support Mark's opening statement, "Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

One interesting element of Mark's Gospel is the noted impetuousness of the Apostle Peter displaying itself right and left. He includes various incriminating details about Peter's betrayal of Jesus (cf. Mark 14:54, 68) that the other Gospel writers pass over in silence, not dwelling upon the shameful details of Peter's denial. Understanding that Mark is writing using the first-hand narrative of Peter and under Peter's supervision, this paints a picture of Peter acting in genuine repentance and calling attention to his own weaknesses and sin without excuse. What a beautiful testimony to the grace and forgiveness of Christ! Peter does not feel the need to hide from his sins, for he knows his sins have been hidden in Christ!

Structure of the Book: The Gospel of Mark is written in three acts. The first act takes place in Galilee (chapters 1-8a), where the main question is one asked by the people to whom Jesus is ministering: "Who is this Jesus?" The second act takes place on the way to Jerusalem (chapters 8b-10), where the main question is one asked by the disciples of Jesus: "Who is this Jesus?" The final act takes place in Jerusalem (chapters 11-16), where the answers are given by Christ—the paradoxical answer that He has become King through very unexpected means (His suffering and death and resurrection).

Introduction to the Gospel According to Mark

About the Author: The Gospel according to Mark was written by the one after whom it is named, Mark, also called John Mark in Scripture. Mark was not one of the 12 Apostles, but he was closely associated with two of the Apostles of Jesus Christ. He was a companion and close friend of Paul's whom he accompanied on his First Missionary Journey (Acts 13:5, Colossians 4:10). He was also a close friend of Peter's, and perhaps even had come to the Christian faith through the ministry of Peter, as Peter refers to Mark as "my son." (1 Peter 5:13)

During his missionary travels as an attendant to the Apostle Paul and his fellow missionary Barnabas, but during the travels departs the company and returns to Jerusalem. (cf. Acts 13:13) Why? We do not know. But it is clear that Mark's desertion upsets the Apostle Paul, so much so, in fact, that when Barnabas [Mark's cousin (cf. Colossians 4:10)] implores that they bring Mark once more on their Second Missionary Journey, Paul refuses, and he and Barnabas split ways. Paul takes young pastor Timothy on his journey instead. However, it is evident that Mark and Paul mended their relationship as during Paul's imprisonment later, he instructs Timothy, "Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is very useful to me for ministry." (2 Tim. 4:11 ESV)



darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by



the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, ¹⁹ since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) 20 And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. 23 All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."


