CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION:

P We have come here today to receive assurance from God that our sins are truly forgiven because of Jesus, and since many of us intend to come to the Holy Supper of our Lord, it is necessary that we examine ourselves. The pronouncement of the General Absolution as well as the forgiveness that is

given in the Sacrament of the Altar are intended by our God for the comfort and strengthening of those who humbly confess their sins, and who hunger and thirst after righteousness.

P I ask you therefore, in the presence of Almighty God, Who searches the heart: Do you truly acknowledge, confess and sorrow over your sins, that by not doing what is good, and by doing what is evil you have grieved and offended your God and Savior by thought, word, and deed, and therefore deserve His eternal condemnation? P Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and for the sake of the sufferings, death, and resurrection of His dear Son Jesus Christ, forgives us all our sins. As a called servant of the Word, I therefore declare unto you the forgiveness of all your sins, In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

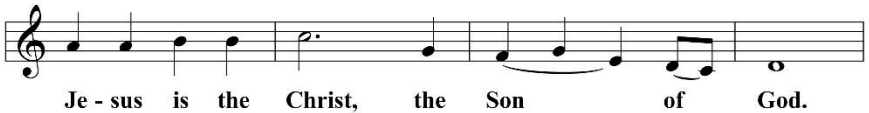
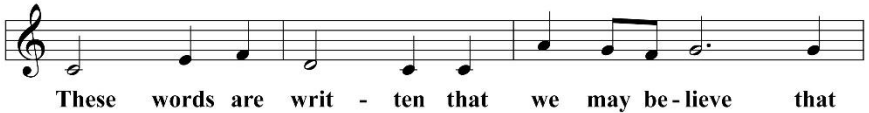

OLD TESTAMENT READING – Job 9:1-13 “Then Job answered and said: 2 “Truly I know it is so, But how can a man be righteous before God? 3 If one wished to contend with Him, He could not answer Him one time out of a thousand. 4 God is wise in heart and mighty in strength. Who has hardened himself against Him and prospered? 5 He removes the mountains, and they do not know When He overturns them in His anger; 6 He shakes the earth out of its place, And its pillars tremble; 7 He commands the sun, and it does not rise; He seals off the stars; 8 He alone spreads out the heavens, And treads on the waves of the sea; 9 He made the Bear, Orion, and the Pleiades, And the chambers of the south; 10 He does great things past finding out, Yes, wonders without number. 11 If He goes by me, I do not see Him; If He moves past, I do not perceive Him; 12 If He takes away, who can hinder Him? Who can say to Him, ‘What are You doing?’ 13 God will not withdraw His anger, The allies of the proud lie prostrate beneath Him.

NEW TESTAMENT READING – Luke 13:1-9 There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And Jesus answered and said to them, “Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? 3 I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. 4 Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? 5 I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish.” 6 He also spoke this parable: “A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. 7 Then he said to the keeper of his vineyard, ‘Look, for three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree and find none. Cut it down; why does it use up the ground?’ 8 But he answered and said to him, ‘Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize it. 9 And if it bears fruit, well. But if not, after that you can cut it down.’ ”

P Here ends the reading of the Scripture lessons. Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and guard it. Alleluia!



CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Nicene Creed

C I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Nov. 07 – Nov. 12, '22

Mon Luke 6:20-23 Man looks on the outward appearance, and sees the poor, the hungry, the weeping, the hated. Jesus has a forward look which even now brings great joy. “Blessed are you!” As we approach the end of another year, may it be with the forward look, “for behold, your reward is great in heaven” (v23).

Tues Hebrews 11:32-40 The saints of old did great things and suffered great things, but the distinguishing mark in all of them was their forward-looking faith in Christ, the gift with more promise than anything else in the world.

Wed Revelation 21:1-6 When God came to see our first parents in the Garden of Eden (Gn3), they hid from Him in fear, but in the new heaven and new earth, God’s dwelling place is with mankind, and His presence brings joy and every blessing in Christ, the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end (cp22:13).

Thurs Luke 20:27-38 Jesus was approached by some who thought the promise of resurrection was foolishness, and tried to make it look so with an extended example of a widow remarrying. Jesus points out that the resurrection we look forward to is to a new life, not the same world we left behind. To show that there is a resurrection, He quotes from Moses to show that even after the patriarch believers had died, the LORD at the burning bush called Himself their God.

Fri Revelation 22:1-5 The angel shows John the new heaven and earth using images which the Scriptures and our present life have made familiar to us: a river, the water of life, bright as crystal, the throne of God, the Lamb, the tree of life, worshipers belonging to God the original source of light (cpGn1:3).

Sat Isaiah 65:17-25 The prophet looks forward to a world in which the taint of sin and all its effects are no more to be found. This is the kingdom of God and of His Christ, which shall continue to be a joy forever, free from all hurt and destruction, says the LORD! (v 25)

“In Every Changing Scene There Is the Unchanging Christ!”
(“Master’s Minute” radio broadcast – November 27, 2006)

Some farmers will always complain about the weather that decreased their crop-yield at harvest. Others will be thankful that the low yields have also raised the market prices for their crops. For some, change seems bad, for others change is good.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 says that there is a “time for every purpose under heaven.” God is always changing things for the good of the Christian, whether we realize it or not (Rom. 8:28). In fact, God must make many changes in our lives if He is going to save us from the devil, our sinful flesh, and this perishing world.

Whether we understand the changes in our lives, or whether they bring pain or pleasure, one thing the Christian knows for sure: “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever” (Heb. 13:8), and He is “the Alpha and the Omega – the beginning and the end” (Rev. 21:6)!

Because God’s love and merciful kindness in Jesus Christ does not change, the Christian is confident that despite his own sins and unworthiness, he may pray to His Savior God in every time of need. We may see change and

decay everywhere we look. We may find it hard to understand or to accept the difficult changes we experience. Yet, because of Jesus, we know that God will never turn us away. May you know this Christ and the certain hope He brings to every changing scene of your life.
