As We Gather

Rest is elusive; as each day ends, we must confess with Paul in today's Epistle "to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find." In our tiredness, the mirror shows that we are wretched indeed. But Zechariah wrote of a day when the battle would be over, thanks to a coming king, who would set the prisoners free. His description points us to Jesus on Palm Sunday; His death and resurrection have set us free from our bondage to sin. His compassion for us shows in His prayer of thanksgiving to our heavenly Father. In our Savior, we find the rest we need each day. Compared to the failing struggle we engage in daily, His yoke is easy, His burden is light. As David wrote in the psalm, "The LORD upholds all who fall, And raises up all who are bowed down." He gives rest for the soul!



¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. ¹⁵ For what I am doing, I do not understand. For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that I do. ¹⁶ If, then, I do what I will not to do, I agree with the law that it is good. ¹⁷ But now, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. ¹⁸ For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find. ¹⁹ For the good that I will to do, I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice. ²⁰ Now if I do what I will not to do, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. ²¹ I find then a law, that evil is present with me, the one who wills to do good. ²² For I delight in the law of God according to the inward man. ²³ But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. ²⁴ O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? ²⁵ I thank God—through Jesus Christ our Lord!


Sermon Text Matthew 11:25-30

The Lord Who Gives Rest



→ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions **→**

July 10 – July 15

Monday: Luke 9:18-22 — It is of the highest importance that Jesus' disciples know that He is the long- promised Christ (Messiah). But they are not yet ready to go out and proclaim this news until He has finished His redemptive work and they understand what kind of salvation He brings.

Tuesday: Luke 9:23-26 — As suffering lay ahead on the path that Jesus walked, so would it also lie on the path of His disciples. But the prize which He wins for humanity is more glorious than all the wealth and honor of the world. So who would give up his eyesight to gain the most beautiful painting in the world?

Wednesday: Acts 5:34-42 – The apostles are on trial for teaching that Jesus is the risen Christ from God. The renowned wise man of the Pharisees counsels a "wait and see" strategy, and the apostles are released, but not without beatings and threats. They rejoice to walk the way of suffering for their Savior.

Thursday: Lamentations 3:22-26 — Although the prophet goes through many afflictions, his confidence is in his Lord, whose mercies are on-going. Because the Lord is his portion, even if he loses everything else, he does not lose hope. Nor does he complain, but waits quietly for the Lord's salvation.

Friday: Lamentations 3:27-32 — If it is good in affliction to hope quietly in the Lord (v26), the sooner in life one can learn this, the better. To trust in Him without complaint, even in dust and disgrace, is to walk the way of the cross. We are confident that He will yet show great compassion because His mercy is so great!

Saturday: Romans 5:1-8 — Knowing that Jesus is the promised Christ brings us peace with God and joy even in the day of affliction. We know that God brought our greatest good from the death of His Son, and He causes the crosses that come upon us to serve our good, too; all of this showing His great love for us!
