Matthew 25:14-30

Look, there you have what is yours.’ ²⁶ “But his lord answered and said to him, ‘You wicked and lazy servant, you knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not scattered seed. ²⁷ So you ought to have deposited my money with the bankers, and at my coming I would have received back my own with

interest.²⁸ So take the talent from him, and give it to him who has ten talents.²⁹ 'For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away.'³⁰ And cast the unprofitable servant into the outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

✠ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions ✠

November 20 - November 25

Monday: John 10:23-30 – Unbelief sometimes pretends that Jesus has not claimed to be the Christ of God. Jesus points to His works in addition to His Word. Both show that it is He who gives eternal life and is one with God the Father.

Tuesday: 1 Thessalonians 5:14-24 – As Jesus' works testified that He is the Christ (Jn10:25), so the works that God accomplishes in the sanctified lives of His believers also glorify the Son and the Father who sent Him.

Wednesday: Psalm 39 – As we approach the end of another year, we are reminded again of the brief time allotted to us in this life. Those suffering afflictions also face similar thoughts. In this short life, God's enduring goodness remains the source of our solid hope (v7).

Thursday: John 6:24-29 – We have so much more to be thankful for than the food which spoils (v27). We also have Him on whom God has placed His seal of approval and who is worthy of our trust and thanks for all eternity.

Friday: 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 – The apostle calls upon us to show God's generosity toward us by being generous to others. Because His grace overflowed to us, it will overflow to others through us, resulting in the thanksgiving of many.

Saturday: Psalm 34:2-9 – David invites us to proclaim the greatness of the Lord with him. That greatness consists in His being a Refuge at all times, and letting us taste His sweet deliverance. Thanks be to God!
