



Epistle Reading

¹¹ Therefore remember that you, once Gentiles in the flesh—who are called Uncircumcision by what is called the Circumcision made in the flesh by hands—¹² that at that time you were without Christ, being aliens from the

Ephesians 2:11-22

commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. ¹³ But now in Christ Jesus vou who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴ For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, ¹⁵ having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, ¹⁶ and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. ¹⁷ And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. ¹⁸ For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹ Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, ²⁰ having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, ²¹ in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, ²² in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.


³⁰ Then the apostles gathered to Jesus and told Him all things, both what they had done and what they had taught. ³¹ And He said to them, "Come aside by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." For there were many coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat. ³² So they departed to a deserted place in the boat by themselves. ³³ But the multitudes saw them departing, and many knew Him and ran there on foot from all the cities. They arrived before them and came together to Him. ³⁴ And Jesus,

when He came out, saw a great multitude and was moved with compassion for them, because they were like sheep not having a shepherd. So He began to teach them many things. ³⁵ When the day was now far spent, His disciples came to Him and said, "This is a deserted place, and already the hour is late. ³⁶ Send them away, that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy themselves bread; for they have nothing to eat." ³⁷ But He answered and said to them, "You give them something to eat." And they said to Him, "Shall we go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give them something to eat?" ³⁸ But He said to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go and see." And when they found out they said, "Five, and two fish." ³⁹ Then He commanded them to make them all sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰ So they sat down in ranks, in hundreds and in fifties. ⁴¹ And when He had taken the five loaves and the two fish. He looked up to heaven, blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to His disciples to set before them; and the two fish He divided among them all. ⁴² So they all ate and were filled. ⁴³ And they took up twelve baskets full of fragments and of the fish. ⁴⁴ Now those who had eaten the loaves were about five thousand men.

Numbers 27:12-23


¹² Now the LORD said to Moses: "Go up into this Mount Abarim, and see the land which I have given to the children of Israel. ¹³ And when you have seen it, you also shall be gathered to your people, as Aaron your brother was gathered. ¹⁴ For in the Wilderness of Zin, during the strife of the congregation, you rebelled against My command to hallow Me at the waters before their eyes." (These are the waters of Meribah, at Kadesh in the Wilderness of Zin.) ¹⁵ Then Moses spoke to the LORD, saying: ¹⁶ "Let the LORD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, set a man over the congregation. ¹⁷ who may go out before them and go in before them, who may lead them out and bring them in, that the congregation of the LORD may not be like sheep which have no shepherd." ¹⁸ And the LORD said to Moses: "Take Joshua the son of Nun with you, a man in whom is the Spirit, and lay your hand on him; 19 set him before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation, and inaugurate him in their sight. ²⁰ And you shall give some of your authority to him, that all the congregation of the children of Israel may be obedient.²¹ He shall stand before Eleazar the priest, who shall inquire before the LORD for him by the judgment of the Urim. At his word they shall go out, and at his word they shall come in, he and all the children of Israel with him-all the congregation." ²² So Moses did as the LORD commanded him. He took Joshua and set him before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation.²³ And he laid his hands on him and inaugurated him, just as the LORD commanded by the hand of Moses.





🕂 Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions 🕂

July 22-27

Monday: Mark 8:34-38 - Jesus calls to both crowd and disciples. To follow Him is to walk not the way of comfort but of the cross (instrument of death). To avoid the way of the cross is to lose the life that He came to give us.

Tuesday: Acts 16:12-15 – Luke has joined Paul's group of missionaries and tells how the Lord called to Lydia by the riverbank and opened her heart to receive the Gospel. Both she and her household are baptized, and she wants to serve the cause.

Wednesday: Exodus 3:1-14 – The Lord calls to Moses from a burning bush which is not consumed. It is the right time to answer His people's cries for help. They will be saved from Egypt through Moses, but it will be the great "I Am" who will save them.

Thursday: Isaiah 54:7-8 – A picture worth repeating: The Lord calls to His people like a bridegroom speaking to His wayward and restored bride. In everlasting mercy He will have compassion on them. He is their Redeemer, the Lord.

Friday: Isaiah 54:9-10 – God calls to His people as He spoke to Noah after the flood. His mercy is everlasting, and even if there is no mountain to set one's foot upon, yet His mercy will not be removed, His covenant of peace will remain.

Saturday: Isaiah 54:11-13 – The Lord calls to His people as to a ruined city. Even the lowliest parts of your buildings will sparkle with sapphires and rubies. Even your boundaries will shine with precious gems. All your children will be taught by the Lord.
