

Old Testament Reading

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

¹ "Now, O Israel, listen to the statutes and the judgments which I teach you to observe, that you may live, and go in and possess the land which the LORD God of your fathers is giving you. ² You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you. ⁶ Therefore be careful to observe them; for this is your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples who will hear all these statutes, and say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.' ⁷ "For what great nation is there that has God so near to it, as the LORD our God is to us, for whatever reason we may call upon Him? ⁸ And what great nation is there that has such statutes and righteous judgments as are in all this law which I set before you this day? ⁹ Only take heed to yourself, and diligently keep yourself, lest you forget the things your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. And teach them to your children and your grandchildren.



¹⁰ Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; ¹⁶ above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints —¹⁹ and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.


Sermon Text Mark 7:14-23

¹⁴ When He had called all the multitude to Himself, He said to them, "Hear Me, everyone, and understand: ¹⁵ There is nothing that enters a man from outside which can defile him; but the things which come out of him, those are the things that defile a man. ¹⁶ If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear!" ¹⁷ When He had entered a house away from the crowd, His disciples asked Him concerning the parable. ¹⁸ So He said to them, "Are you thus without understanding also? Do you not perceive that whatever enters a man from outside cannot defile him, ¹⁹ because it does not enter his heart but his stomach, and is eliminated, thus purifying all foods?" ²⁰ And He said, "What comes out of a man, that defiles a man. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, ²² thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lewdness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within and defile a man."

September 2-7

Monday: Matthew 10:16-22 – The path on which Jesus sends His disciples is one of devilish opposition, but not to worry! God will give them the response to give (verse 19) and salvation in the end (verse 22).

Tuesday: Matthew 10:28-31 – When brought face to face with those who can kill the body, Jesus says not to fear! God, who watches over the smallest details in all of creation, is in fact "your Father" (verse 29).

Wednesday: Matthew 10:32-38 – Even when the path leads to opposition, it also brings the opportunity to confess that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. He who loved us and laid down His life to save us forever is our greatest love and truest Friend!

Thursday: Ephesians 2:19-22 – Whether we are Jew or Gentile, or any other human designation, in Christ we are members of God's household. Together with all believers we are like a building, a temple for the Lord.

Friday: Proverbs 4:14-19 – It does indeed make a difference which path we walk down, and we are urged to walk the way of the righteous (verse 18). The difference is that of light and darkness. The Way is Jesus.

Saturday: Proverbs 4:20-23 – The Word of our heavenly Father in our hearts: this is the source of life. From this flows the life that follows the path which is like the light of dawn, shining brighter and brighter until it is day (verse 18).
