As We Gather

In Psalm 12, King David cries out, "Help, Lord, for the godly man ceases! For the faithful disappear from among the sons of men" (v. 1). The Lord God's anointed king lives in a troubling world! Many centuries later, Martin Luther paraphrased the words of David, writing in a hymn text in 1523: "O Lord, look down from heav'n, behold and let Thy pity waken; . . . dark times have us o'ertaken" (TLH 260:1). Looking at our world today, we can relate to both King David and Martin Luther. Yet both men expressed hope in their written words. In his psalm, David writes, "The words of the Lord are pure words, . . . You shall keep them, O Lord" (vv. 6a, 7a). And Luther confidently writes, "So through God's Word shall men endure each trial and temptation" (TLH 260:5). Reformation Day echoes the call to faithfulness heard by God's people through the ages. May we listen well.

October 28 – November 2

Monday: Luke 10:17-20 – When the Lord sent out seventy to prepare for His coming, they returned rejoicing in the victory over Satan which He shared with them. He points them to a cause for joy far greater!

Tuesday: Luke 10:21-22 – Jesus rejoices that knowing God as Father does not depend on human wisdom or intellect, but is given by God through His Son even to little children.

Wednesday James 5:7-11 – As we wait for the Lord's return, James urges us all to exercise patience, not only toward the Lord who comes, but also toward one another and in the face of suffering.
