





And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled?" ⁵ And Jesus. answering them, began to say: "Take heed that no one deceives you. 6 For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am He,' and will deceive many. ⁷ But when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be troubled; for such things must happen, but the end is not yet. ⁸ For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. And there will be earthquakes in various places, and there will be famines and troubles. But he who endures to the end shall be saved.





+ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions +

November 18 - November 23

Monday: John 11:21-27 – To look forward to the resurrection on the last day is to look forward to Christ's coming on the last day. In Him is life, the light of mankind (1:4).

Tuesday: 2 Thessalonians 2:1-12 — Paul warns about false reports of Christ's second coming; but first would come powerful opposition from the lawless one, already at work, to be revealed and overcome by Christ.

Wednesday: Isaiah 35:4-10 – Be strong, unafraid in the face of opposition. It is God who will come to judge the evil which opposes Him, and to bring healing and everlasting joy to those ransomed by Him (verse 10).

Thursday: Luke 12:35-40 — The Master's return brings wondrous blessings: He serves the servants (verse 37)! But the servants need to be ready at all times for His coming.

Friday: Philippians 1:12-21 – Paul is in chains because he preaches the good news of Christ, and as this becomes known, Christ is proclaimed. So whether Paul lives or dies, Christ will be magnified, a cause for joy!

Saturday: Revelation 21:1-7 — What could be better than God dwelling with people (verse 3)? No more tears, no more sorrow, no more crying, no more pain! All this from the One sitting on the throne, our Savior!
