





**Looking Forward to Thanksgiving Day Worship**: Our Thanksgiving worship service is this Thursday at 10:15 am. As we gather for this service, we'll reflect on God's gracious provision and steadfast faithfulness, as Moses reminded the Israelites in Deuteronomy 8:1-10. Just as God led His people through the wilderness, humbling and testing them to show His power and provide for their every need, He continues to sustain us today. Come join us in giving thanks to the Lord, who satisfies us with blessings far beyond what we deserve, and who calls us to remember His mercy, respond with gratitude, and trust in Him for all that lies ahead.

**Sunday Advent Worship Series** – **A Real Christmas**: A parent says, "I want to give my kids a real Christmas." What do you think that parent means? Perhaps they are thinking of trimming a freshly cut tree, finding the perfect presents, or spending the holidays with extended family. Perhaps they are thinking about all those things. "Then it will be a real Christmas!"

Certainly, all those are wonderful things. However, none of them are what makes Christmas real. The sad truth is Christmas is the most beloved holiday of so many, yet so few know what Christmas is really about.

If you want a real Christmas, then you need to observe Advent. Advent is Latin for "coming." In the season of Advent, Christians observe the connection between the first time the Son of God came into our world as the Savior and the second time He will come as the Judge. Advent prepares our minds and hearts, so that we might soon celebrate a real Christmas.

Our worship in the season of Advent follows this path:

• First Sunday in Advent (December 1) A Real Christmas Requires Remembering Why Christ Came Sermon Text: 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

- Second Sunday in Advent (December 8) A Real Christmas Is Rooted in Repentance Sermon Text: Luke 3:1-6
- Third Sunday in Advent (December 15) A Real Christmas Results in Great Joy Sermon Text: Luke 3:7-18
- Fourth Sunday in Advent (December 22) A Real Christmas Will Lift Up the Lowly Sermon Text: Luke 1:39-55

Join us in worship this Advent season to prepare for a truly meaningful celebration of our Savior's birth!

Advent Midweek Services: "The Christmas Trees of Scripture": The most widely recognized symbol of the season—the Christmas tree—has deep connections to our faith. While other religions used evergreen branches to symbolize eternal life, it was the Lutherans of 16th-century Germany who began the tradition of bringing evergreen trees indoors during the holidays. They adorned the trees with red ornaments, representing the blood of Christ, and with candles, symbolizing the light of Christ. The tree was often topped with a star or angel, pointing to the story of Jesus' birth. The Christmas tree is a cherished part of our celebration of Christ's coming.

In our Midweek Advent Services, we will focus on some "Christmas trees" found in Scripture. These are not evergreens, nor are they decorated with lights or ornaments, but they point us to the Christ and the salvation He brings. These trees remind us why the birth of Jesus Christ is so worthy of celebration.

Service Schedule and Themes:

- Midweek One December 4 at 2:00 pm Sermon Text: Genesis 3:15 Theme: The Tree of Rebellion
- Midweek Two December 11 at 2:00 pm Sermon Text: Isaiah 11:1-10 Theme: The Tree of Promise
- Midweek Three December 18 at 2:00 pm Sermon Text: Revelation 22:1-5 Theme: The Tree of Life

Join us as we reflect on these trees and the life and hope we have in Christ this Advent season!

# H Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions H November 25 - November 30

**Monday:** John 5:19-29 – As we ponder the end times and the day of Judgment, we rejoice that the Father has entrusted all judgment to the Son. He is none other than the source of eternal life (verse 24)!

**Tuesday: Hebrews 12:18-24** – How thankful we can be that our hope of eternal life is not based on Mt. Sinai's fearful message (verse 21), but on Mt. Zion's message of Jesus' cleansing blood (verse 24)!

**Wednesday: Revelation 7:9-17** – John reports a vision of joyful deliverance from great tribulation and robes made white through washing in the blood of the Lamb. With such cleansing comes also relief from all trouble and tears.

**Thursday: Matthew 15:29-39** – For healing care and nourishment thousands thanked God that day (verse 31) on the mountain. For just seven loaves of bread and a few small fish Jesus gave thanks to His God and Father (verse 36).

**Friday: Psalm 145:15-21** – Truly God feeds and sustains every living thing. And to those who call on Him, His presence, His hearing ear, and His watchful eye are given. His name be praised forever!

**Saturday: Deuteronomy 26:1-11** – Moses teaches the people of God to acknowledge the Giver of both their new land and the harvest from it, and to rejoice in all the good things that the Lord has given to them.
