Isaiah 65:17-25

¹⁷ "For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; And the former shall not be remembered or come to mind. 18 But be glad and rejoice forever in what I create; For behold, I create Jerusalem as a rejoicing, And her people a joy. 19 I will rejoice in Jerusalem, And joy in My people; The voice of weeping shall no longer be heard in her, Nor the voice of crying. 20 "No more shall an infant from there live but a few days, Nor an old man who has not fulfilled his days; For the child shall die one hundred years old, But the sinner being one hundred years old shall be accursed. ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; They shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. ²² They shall not build and another inhabit; They shall not plant and another eat; For as the days of a tree, so shall be the days of My people, And My elect shall long enjoy the work of their hands. ²³ They shall not labor in vain, Nor bring forth children for trouble; For they shall be the descendants of the blessed of the LORD, And their offspring with them. 24 "It shall come to pass That before they call, I will answer; And while they are still speaking, I will hear. ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, The lion shall eat straw like the ox, And dust shall be the serpent's food. Epistle Reading


1 Corinthians 15:19-26

¹⁹ If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable. ²⁰ But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. ²³ But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those who are Christ's at His coming. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father, when He puts an end to all rule and all authority and power. ²⁵ For He must reign till He has put all enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy that will be destroyed is death.

¹ Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. ² But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. ³ Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. 5 Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee, 7 saying, 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.' " ⁸ And they remembered His words. ⁹ Then they returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them, who told these things to the apostles. ¹¹ And their words seemed to them like idle tales, and they did not believe them. 12 But Peter arose and ran to the tomb; and stooping down, he saw the linen cloths lying by themselves; and he departed, marveling to himself at what had happened.


Sermon Text Psalm 16





Ḥ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions **Ḥ**

April 21 – April 26, 2025

Monday – *Matthew 28:1-10*

Jesus has risen even before the women arrive at the tomb. The angel rolls away the stone to allow them to come and see the empty tomb! As they hurry away, Jesus meets them, risen indeed!

Tuesday – 1 Corinthians 15:20-28

The significance of Christ's resurrection for us is seen in His representing the children of Adam. "As in Adam they all die, so also in Christ they all will be made alive" (v. 22). Death is doomed!

Wednesday – *Job* 19:22-27

Job's friends have not helped him with their accusations, but he looks to his living Redeemer, who will bring him into the presence of God, whom he will see with his very own eyes.

Thursday – Isaiah 25:1-8

Isaiah sings of the LORD's triumph over all enemies, even death itself (v. 8)! The result is described as a wondrous banquet on the mountain, when tears will be wiped away from every face.

Friday - John 20:11-18

Jesus' body is not in the tomb, but He is not running away. He comes to Mary Magdalene, calls her by name (cf. 10:2-3), and sends her to His brothers with triumphant words of comfort!

Saturday – 1 Corinthians 15:35-49

Some who object to a resurrection of the dead point to the decrepit bodies we lay in the grave. But that body is like a seed and when it is raised again it will be a glorious, imperishable body!
