As We Gather

"Comfort, comfort my people," says your God. In the midst of a weary world, the voice of the prophet Isaiah rings out across the centuries, calling us into the wilderness to prepare a highway for our King. But this preparation is not a matter of earth and stone; it is a matter of the soul. We all carry a spiritual geography—uneven terrain marked by the "rough places" of our human condition. While the glory of nations fades like withered grass, the Word of our God stands forever, promising that the glory of the Lord shall be revealed. As we worship today, let us quiet our hearts to behold the Shepherd who comes with power to rule and a gentle arm to gather His lambs.

Confession and Absolution

Beloved in the Lord, Advent is a time of preparation. The prophet calls us to prepare the way of the Lord, yet in our hearts, we do not find a straight highway for God. Instead, we find the uneven ground of sin: mountains of pride, valleys of despair, crooked paths of deception, and rough places of anger. These obstacles hinder our faith and separate us from our neighbor. Therefore, let us draw near to God our Father, confessing our sins and asking Him, for the sake of His Son, to smooth the rough places of our hearts.

- P O Almighty God, merciful Father,
- We confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have not prepared Your way, allowing rough places of conflict and crooked paths of selfishness to remain in our hearts. We have trusted in the world's withering grass rather than Your eternal Word. Like sheep, we have gone astray. Have mercy on us. Forgive, renew, and lead us, that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.
- P "Comfort, yes, comfort My people!" says your God. "Speak comfort to Jerusalem, and cry out to her, that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned." Upon this, your confession, I, as a called servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Epistle Reading

2 Peter 3:8-14

⁸ But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up. ¹¹ Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness, ¹² looking for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the

heavens will be dissolved, being on fire, and the elements will melt with fervent heat? ¹³ Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells. ¹⁴ Therefore, beloved, looking forward to these things, be diligent to be found by Him in peace, without spot and blameless.

came to John the son of Zacharias in the wilderness. ³ And he went into all the region around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins, ⁴ as it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet, saying: "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the LORD; Make His paths straight. ⁵ Every valley shall be filled And every mountain and hill brought low; The crooked places shall be made straight And the rough ways smooth; ⁶ And all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"

Luther's Explanation of the Second Article


Sermon Text Isaiah 40:1-11

mouth of the LORD has spoken." ⁶ The voice said, "Cry out!" And he said, "What shall I cry?"
