## As We Gather

When nations or sports teams select a mascot, they invariably choose symbols of strength, ferocity, or majesty. Eagles soar; lions roar; bears intimidate. No one rallies behind a symbol of weakness. From a human perspective, a lamb is a disastrous choice for a leader—defenseless, silent, and destined for slaughter. Yet, when John the Baptist unveils the Savior of the world in our Gospel lesson, he does not point to a conquering King, but to a Lamb. Why would God choose what appears to be the "Worst Mascot in History"? As we gather to worship, we prepare our hearts to behold the Lamb of God and discover why this seemingly weak title is the only one that can save us.

#### Confession and Absolution

**P** The world seeks a savior of iron and gold, a conqueror to break the nations. We naturally gravitate toward symbols of strength and dominance. Yet, the prophet pointed not to a lion or a bear, but to a Lamb. Since our hearts are captured by worldly power, we overlook the power of God displayed in sacrifice. Let us therefore confess our sins to God our Father, acknowledging our pride and failure to follow the Lamb.

**C** Almighty God, we confess that we are captivated by the strength of this world. We desire power, prestige, and victory on our own terms. We are often ashamed of weakness and despise suffering. In our pride, we have looked for salvation in our own might rather than in the humility of Your Son. Forgive us for turning away from the Lamb of God. Wash us in His blood, and grant us eyes to see that true strength is found in Your mercy and true life is found in His sacrifice.

**P** God chose the foolish and weak to shame the wise and mighty. Behold the Lamb of God! He has taken away the sin of the world—He has taken away your sin. Upon this confession, as a called servant of the Word, I announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

John 1:29-41


<sup>29</sup> The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, “Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!” <sup>30</sup> This is He of whom I said, ‘After me comes a Man who is preferred before me, for He was before me.’ <sup>31</sup> I did not know Him; but that He should be revealed to Israel, therefore I came baptizing with water.” <sup>32</sup> And John bore witness, saying, “I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and He remained upon Him. <sup>33</sup> I did not know Him, but He who sent me to baptize with water said to me, ‘Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.’” <sup>34</sup> And I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God.” <sup>35</sup> Again, the next day, John stood with two of his disciples. <sup>36</sup> And looking at Jesus as He walked, he said, “Behold the Lamb of God!” <sup>37</sup> The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup> Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, “What do you seek?” They said to Him, “Rabbi” (which is to say, when translated, Teacher), “where are You staying?” <sup>39</sup> He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day (now it was about the tenth hour). <sup>40</sup> One of the two who heard John speak, and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. <sup>41</sup> He first found his own brother Simon, and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated, the Christ).

# ✠ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions ✠

January 19 – January 24, 2026

## **Monday** - *John 2:1-11*

Jesus' glory is revealed through His provision of wine for a wedding banquet. His gifts in little Cana are not only generous (verse 6), but they are also of the highest quality (verse 10).

## **Tuesday** - *Romans 12:6-16a*

Our faith influences our use of the gifts which God has given to us, for faith works by love. Our love for the Lord will lead us also to love those for whom He died and to hate what is evil.

## **Wednesday** - *Deuteronomy 18:15-19*

Like Moses, the promised Prophet would be a true human and Mediator, but not just for Israel. He would bring mankind to the God of forgiveness and salvation!

## **Thursday** - *Psalms 16*

The one whom God guards does not chase after another god, but has a glorious inheritance that brings gladness to the heart. This is the glory which Christ shares with us!

## **Friday** - *Psalms 14*

Like the fools who deny God's existence, by ourselves we deserve nothing but punishment from Him. But the LORD restores His people and provides salvation for them, as He promised of old! (verse 7)

## **Saturday** - *Luke 19:1-10*

The Lord's saving glory is seen as He passes through Jericho. Jesus seeks out Zacchaeus, one who helps the Romans exploit Israel, and He brings salvation also to this son of Abraham (verse 9).
